Dear Property Owners and Residents:

Subject: Notice of County Bridge Replacement Project (BF 76930)

We are writing to let you know that Sturgeon County is planning significant infrastructure improvements in your area this year. The bridge culvert structure on Township Road 552 east of Range Road 273 has been in service since 1969. It is now nearing the end of its serviceable life. To ensure the safety of those using the bridge, the County is planning to replace it in 2024.

Scope of work:

The project involves removing the current culvert, improvements to the road, and installing a new structure. We will have a better idea of when this work will be done once a contractor is selected.

What this means to you:

There will be Sturgeon County project personnel and contractor crews working within and around the project area. Detour signage will be placed on the roads, and advance notice will be provided.

Please be aware that construction schedules may change depending on weather conditions.
