Whereas, Sturgeon County understands the importance of community engagement to provide understanding of Red Dress Day and the issues faced by Indigenous communities;

Whereas, Sturgeon County stands in solidarity with Indigenous peoples and all other people in Canada calling for change, by promoting awareness about the disproportionate violence faced by Indigenous women, girls, and two-spirit individuals.

Therefore, I, Alanna Hnatiw, Mayor of Sturgeon County, do hereby proclaim May 5, 2024, as Red Dress Day in Sturgeon County as an expression of our commitment to awareness and change, and to honour the lives of those who have been affected.
