We are respectful requesting to appeal the Development Permit Number 305305-25-D0126 at #33 55312 Rge Rd 241, Sturgeon County.

#### **DEVELOPMENT PERMIT**

This correspondence pertains to the development permit approval for the following project:

"Development permit for an uncovered deck for an above-ground swimming pool at 33-55312 Rge Rd 241 (8120281;2;34).

Development permit number: 305305-25-D0126

Approved use: Accessory Building"

This request is being submitted on behalf of Mr. Lyle Pearce and Ms. Sandra Thomas, who are the landowners of 31 55312 Rge Rd 241. We reside adjacent to the registered landowners, Mr. Gregg and Mrs. Debra Blomquist.

#### Introduction

We are writing to request the opportunity to address the Legislative Service Board, regarding significant concerns relating to Development permit number: 305305-25-D0126 at 33 55312 Rge 241. We believe that the permit application submitted was founded on information that is false, misleading, and inaccurate concerning its intended use by the registered landowners. Please note that we are <u>not</u> contesting the structural integrity of the building. However, we seek to appeal the following points:

- 1. The landowners have provided inaccurate and misleading information concerning the intended use of the structure.
- 2. The identification of the structure as a "deck" is incorrect; it is, in fact, a dock specifically designed for running and diving activities for canines.
- 3. We seek to evaluate the permissibility of installing an industry-standard, regulation-sized dog diving pool within a residential zoning area. Blomquist structure includes a designated running ramp, two distinct levels of a diving docks, equipped with accessible ramps and other related dog diving safety features.
- 4. We contend that the scale and commercial nature of this structure contravene land use bylaws, as it is evidently intended for business purposes. Such a structure is more appropriately situated within a commercial zone rather than a residential zone.

It is our belief that the landowners submitted false information regarding the intended use of the structure under consideration. The aforementioned structure has been utilized for an unlawful commercial enterprise known as K9Drifters, which operates as a dog diving business on this residential property from July 12 to September 22, 2025. This raises significant concerns regarding its compliance with land use zoning bylaws. Moreover, it is important to note that the dog diving dock and pool structure were specifically designed and constructed to adhere to industry regulatory standards pertinent to the operations of dog diving sport. This facility is evidently not intended for private residential use and was built explicitly for the operation of a dog diving pool business.

We are submitting this appeal at this time and not earlier is due to our involvement with the planning and development compliance officer's summer long investigation. This investigation determined that the landowners were conducting an illegal dog diving business, which resulted in the cessation of operations effective September 22, 2025. With the business aspects of our concerns now resolved, we must address the remaining issues related to the structure itself, specifically how the permit was initially approved for a commercial structure.

We would like to bring to your attention several concerns regarding the nearby structure:

- 1. The proximity of this structure to our residence is aesthetically displeasing, intrusive, and infringes upon our right to both enjoyment and privacy. This particularly affects our ability to enjoy our backyard, sunroom, master bedroom, and kitchen.
- 2. The substantial size of the structure, coupled with the surrounding wired fencing, negatively impacts the market value of our property.
- 3. Although business operations have temporarily ceased, the proprietors of K9Drifters continue to utilize the pool for diving activities. It is noteworthy that the individuals involved do not reside on the property; rather, they arrive solely for the purpose of using the pool and depart following each session.
- 4. The increased noise levels resulting from barking dogs and commands being issued contravene established nuisance laws.
- 5. There has been a noticeable surge in traffic generated by the business owners arriving with acquaintances to utilize the pool structure.
- 6. Given the dimensions of the structure, including the running dock, 2 separate ramps levels and pool size, exceeds the typical specifications for a residential swimming pool, combined with its identified commercial use, it is evident that the structure is not suitable for a residential zone.

We possess substantial evidence through social media pictures, reviews posting, and videotapes of illegal operations that supports our assertion that the intended usage described in the permit application was misleading, which are attached to this report. Based on this false information, the permit was granted.

#### Location of Pool Structure in Relation to Our Residence

The pool structure is positioned to the northeast of our residence, resulting in a direct line of sight from the sunroom and kitchen areas. The sounds of water and individuals utilizing the pool are audible at all times from the sunroom, kitchen, and master bedroom. The size of the structure is considerably large. As previously noted, it was specifically designed to comply with the regulatory standards associated with competitive diving dock sports, as detailed in the accompanying social media post. It is important to emphasize that this structure does not represent the typical recreational backyard swimming pool.

#### **K9Drifters Business Owners**

The landowners and the owners of K9Srifters are 2 separate entities. Gregg and Debra Blomquist are the registered landowners which the pool is located on. Haley Blomquist-Schafer and Kaelan Kelty are the owners of K9Drifter. As stated neither of the owners resides on the property.

Haley Blomquist-Schafer serves as the Co-Founder and Trainer at K9Drifters and is the biological daughter to the landowners.

Kaelan Kelly functions as the Co-Founder and Head Trainer.

They visit the site to conduct business operations and facilitate training sessions before departing. Furthermore, there are no approved home business licenses to operate K9Drifters as a dog diving dock business. According to the criteria for home business licenses, it is a requirement for an owner of the business to reside on the premises.

Additionally, I would like to note that we followed the proper complaint procedures by contacting the Development and Planning department in combination with the County Compliance Bylaw. The Compliance Bylaw Officer has already been notified of the situation, conducted an in-depth investigation which resulted in 3 verbal warnings and a written warning letter has been ordered to cease operations.

#### Explanation for Delay in Appeal Submission

We wish to articulate in detail our concerns regarding the absence of an appeal within the designated 21-day period.

- 1. Prior to the commencement of construction, we were unaware of any plans to build a pool and did not receive any communication regarding this matter.
- Furthermore, there was no engagement with the landowners prior to or during the construction phase concerning potential developments or the specific nature of the structure, which we subsequently identified as a recreational swimming pool.

- 3. Additionally, we were not presented with any architectural drawings or plans related to the project. According to the information submitted in the landowners' permit application, which indicated the intended use of the structure as a "recreational swimming pool," it appears that development and planning policies do not mandate that notices be distributed to impacted residents regarding the issuance of the permit Consequently, we were not notified by the department about the pending permit approval or given an opportunity to appeal the decision.
- 4. Construction of the pool did not commence until after the deadline of June 19. We only became aware of the pool's construction after the project began post-deadline, as the landowners had withheld information about the development until after the appeal period had lapsed. The apparent design of the pool raised our concerns when it became increasingly evident that it did not conform to the characteristics of a standard family pool but appeared to be more advanced in nature.
- 5. The pool was completed and became operational on July 21. Although K9Drifters began operations with open dock time on that date, we did not learn the business name until July 12, the day of the "Grand Opening INAUGURAL Pool Party." At that event, over 40 dogs were present, along with traffic directing signs at various locations including the mailboxes and the main entrance to the Cameron Park Subdivision. There were also signs directing traffic from Highway 37 onto Range Road 241, provision of portable restrooms, food service conducted without an Alberta Health food license, and event staff in custom-colored identification t-shirts.
- 6. The event was promoted on social media, which included maps indicating the location of the party, an event parking map, and details about raffles and giveaways, as well as ribbons and prizes for attendees.
- 7. Social media advertisements described the pool's design by stating that "K9 Drifters Sport Club is a dog sports facility that features a dock diving pool, offering training sessions, events, and a supportive environment for dogs and handlers. Their outdoor pool is designed for training and competition, prioritizing accessibility, safety, and success."

#### K9Drifrers services advertise on social media:

#### **Key Features:**

- Dock Diving Pool: <u>A regulation-sized pool equipped with a dock and safety</u> features
- Training Sessions: Available for dogs of all skill levels, focusing on foundations, dryland skills, and dock diving techniques
- Events: Hosting competitions and activities, such as the "Can my dog do that?" introductory session
- Accessibility: Wheelchair ramps, accessible bathroom, and welcoming layout ensure inclusivity

#### **Training and Events:**

- Swim lessons and intro to dock diving sessions are offered throughout the week
- Pool rental options are available for private sessions
- Competitions and events are scheduled throughout the season, including league nights and tournaments.

K9 Drifters Sport Club aims to foster a sense of community among dog owners and handlers, promoting the sport of dock diving and supporting dog athletes. With its focus on safety, accessibility, and fun, the club provides an excellent environment for dogs to thrive"

"Services includes: Book your session: Visit the K9 Drifters website and use the booking portal to schedule your swim time. ®

 Enjoy the pool: The facility is located 15 minutes north of Edmonton and provides life jackets and toys for your dog.

#### Types of sessions

- Private instruction sessions: These include an instructor and are mandatory for all new clients.
- Self-service swimming: After completing the introduction, you can book self-service sessions without an instructor
- Pool parties: You can also book the pool for half-day private parties.

#### Social Media Reviews states:

As per a review posted on social media states ..

". 100/10 recommend! K9 Drifters is a club founded by people who are highly experienced in dog sports (dock diving included), so all of that knowledge is clearly displayed in the high quality construction of this facility. The pool's ramp is elongated so that it is not too steep and all of the top notch turf on the short dock. and 40' regulation dock is sufficiently stapled down.

#### Another social review states:

"The Drifters Dock is an incredibly welcoming place where dogs can learn to swim at their own pace. Owners are able to get into the water which allows the dogs to feel more comfortable if they are nervous jumping into the pool. The facility is well built with the highest quality turf that allows the dogs to have great traction for jumping and three ways for the dogs to get into the pool. They offer both introduction sessions and pool rental time for more advanced dogs. Kaelan and Haley were instrumental in teaching my dog to jump off the dock on his own. They worked at his pace and never pushed him past his comfort level. Their Pool Party event was a blast. Filled with laughter, cheering, and fun new games. Both dogs and humans alike had so much fun. This is a must visit for dock dogs of all levels. Whole structure itself uses the natural slope of the ground, so you don't actually have to climb any stairs or tall steep ramps yourself to get onto the dock!

#### TIME LINE AND DETAILS

May 29: Development approval granted for an 'uncovered deck for an above ground swimming pool

June 12: K9Drifters started advertising on social media the opening of the outdoor pool

• **Eight days prior** to the conclusion of the appeal notification period and preceding the commencement of excavation of the diving dock and pool

From May 29 to June 19, a 21-day notification period was established for the purpose of appealing the permit in question. The permit explicitly identifies the intended use of the structure as "recreational." However, it has come to light <u>after the 21-day appeal notification period</u> the actual intention behind the construction of this pool is to operate a dog diving dock which has been tailored to adhere to industry standards specific to the dog diving sport

Key design elements include dimensions that align with the most commonly used regulations set forth by the North American Diving Dogs (NADD), which stipulates a pool size of 21 feet by 45 feet and a depth of 52 inches. It is noteworthy that other associations may utilize alternative standard sizes, such as 21 feet by 4 feet by 49 feet.

Regarding the dock design: What are Dog Diving Industry Standards

- \*\*Dimensions\*\*: The dock should be approximately 40 feet long and 8 feet wide.
- \*\*NADD Standards\*\*. The dock is constructed in compliance with NADD standards to provide a secure launching point for dogs.

The following key design considerations are vital:

- \*\*Safety\*\*: The design should incorporate easy entry and exit points, including ramps or areas resembling a shallow beach, to facilitate safe water access for dogs.
- \*\*Water Depth\*\*: The water depth must be sufficient to ensure safety for diving dogs.
- \*\*Filtration\*\*: Robust filtration and sanitation systems are essential since dogs may introduce debris and hair into the water.
- \*\*Liner Protection\*\*: It is advisable to utilize concrete over the liner or implement a thick gravel layer in shallow areas to mitigate damage from dog claws.
- \*\*Non-Slip Surfaces\*\*: The installation of non-slip mats and turf around the pool area is recommended to enhance safety.

The design of the Blomquist pool complies with all of the basic applicable industry standards and specifications. However, the exact specifications of the pool design are unknown to us, as we have not had access to the permit drawings. Notably, according to the online K9Drifters website service outline and participants/user reviews, the pool meets "industry-regulated" standards. It is essential to highlight that this pool design deviates considerably from what one might typically expect in a residential backyard recreational pool setting. Attached images and postings are included as part of the appeal package.

We are going to state again, the inaccuracies in the permit application significantly misrepresented the intended use of the facility as a dog diving business. Had the application accurately reflected this purpose, along with an officially sanctioned home-based license, proper notifications would have been disseminated, and an appeal could have been pursued. The lack of awareness regarding the true intentions of the business until its initiation, coupled with the expiration of the appeal period, highlights the misleading and erroneous information provided by the property owners during the permitting process.

The resulting impact on our quality of life and enjoyment of our property has been substantial.

July 8: K9Drifters began operations in the diving pool.

July 12: Grand Opening Pool Diving Party.

- Had over 40 dogs and handlers/owners in attendance
- Served food without an AH food permit.

**September 5:** A written warning letter was issued by the Planning and Development Compliance Officer, after 3 verbal warnings were not respected or adhere to, instructing the cessation of all business operations related to K9Drifters. This directive included the requirement to remove all associated social media platforms that contained the address maps, and pool booking schedule relevant to the business.

**September 21:** K9Drifters formally complied with the order issued on September 5 to deactivate majority of the social media platforms. It is important to note, however, that the domain website for K9Drifters remains active, featuring a fully functional CONTACT page accessible at K9Drifter.com.

#### **Summary and Conclusion**

However, concerns remain regarding the continued existence of a structure that does not align with the original intended use stated in the permit. Again we are not challenging the structural integrity or construction of the building, rather, our focus is on how the permit was obtained through misinformation. Had the permit application accurately reflected its intended commercial use, the permit would not have been issued.

The delay in the initial appeal can be attributed to a lack of accurate information regarding the intended purpose of the structure, as well as a summer long investigation into illegal activities. We were not adequately informed that the dog diving dock and pool would operate as a commercial enterprise, nor were we made aware of the extent to which this structure would be intrusive, and imposing until construction commenced and business activities began. The resultant impact on our quality of life and enjoyment of our property has been significant.

Had the genuine intentions regarding this structure been fully disclosed in the permit application, we believe that Sturgeon County would not have authorized the permit. Furthermore, had there been transparency on the part of the landowners and had we received the necessary information in a timely manner, we would have pursued an appeal within the appropriate timeframe. Regrettably, this was not the case.

Therefore, we respectfully request the opportunity to present our concerns with supporting evidence to the committee.

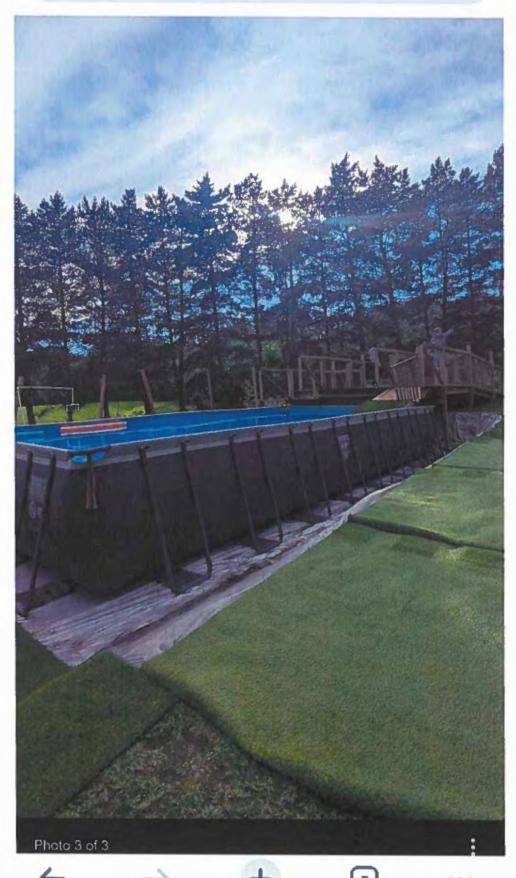

#### **Subdivision and Development Appeal Hearing Process**

The hearing is a formal meeting and the length of time can vary. Hearings are generally scheduled Tuesday afternoons at the Sturgeon County Centre in the Town of Morinville or via videoconference.

Persons who file an appeal are expected to make a verbal presentation to the Board. Persons who have been notified of the appeal also have the right to present a verbal, written and/or visual presentation to the Board. *This information should be submitted to the Secretary at least five (5) days in advance of the hearing, so it can be included within the hearing package*. If desired, parties may have someone, or an agent, speak on their behalf. If a number of appeals are filed on the same subdivision or development, it is recommended that a spokesperson be selected to organize presentations so that evidence is not repetitive.

The Board is not an evidence seeking body. It relies on the written evidence presented, as well as verbal submissions at the hearing, as the basis for their decision. Therefore, it is critical that persons appearing before the Board ensure that sufficient evidence is presented to support their respective positions.

When presenting an appeal, keep in mind the Board does not consider precedent when making its decision. Each application is judged on its own merits.

#### At the hearing . . .

Anyone in attendance with an interest in the appeal enters the hearing room, joins the videoconference, or dials in just before the scheduled start time of the hearing on the scheduled date of the hearing.

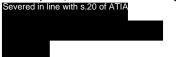
- 1. The meeting is called to order by the Chair.
- 2. The Chair welcomes everyone and gives a brief outline as to how the hearing will proceed.
- 3. The Chair will have all board members, staff and people involved in the appeal introduce themselves and those present are asked if there are any objections to the Board members hearing the appeal.

- 4. A representative of Sturgeon County Planning and Development will outline the background of the appeal and why the decision was made.
- 5. The Chairman will then ask:
  - The Appellant to introduce themselves for the record.
  - The Appellant then presents his/her position or concerns with respect to the matter being considered by the Board. Development Appeal Board members question the Appellant.
  - Clearly state your reasons for the appeal.
     Information such as photographs, illustrative materials and well-prepared drawings that you wish to present should be submitted to the Secretary at least five (5) days in advance of the hearing, so that the information can be included within the hearing package that is circulated.
  - Stick to the planning facts and support them with quantifiable (measurable) data.
  - State the detailed issues about the site in the context of the surrounding properties and the impact on the community.
  - The Board will then hear from anyone else in favor of the appeal (persons who filed an appeal or support the position of the Appellant). Following each presentation Board members may ask questions.
  - The Board will then hear from anyone opposed to the appeal (persons who opposethe position of the Appellant).
- 6. After all presentations have been heard, the Chairman will give the Appellants the right to respond to new information. This is an opportunity to refute information and evidence presented since the last time you spoke that you could not have reasonably anticipated. It is not an opportunity to reargue your case or create new argument.
- 7. The Chairman advises that the Board will deliberate in a Closed Session and a written decision will be mailed within 15 days from the date of the decision as per legislation.

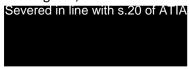

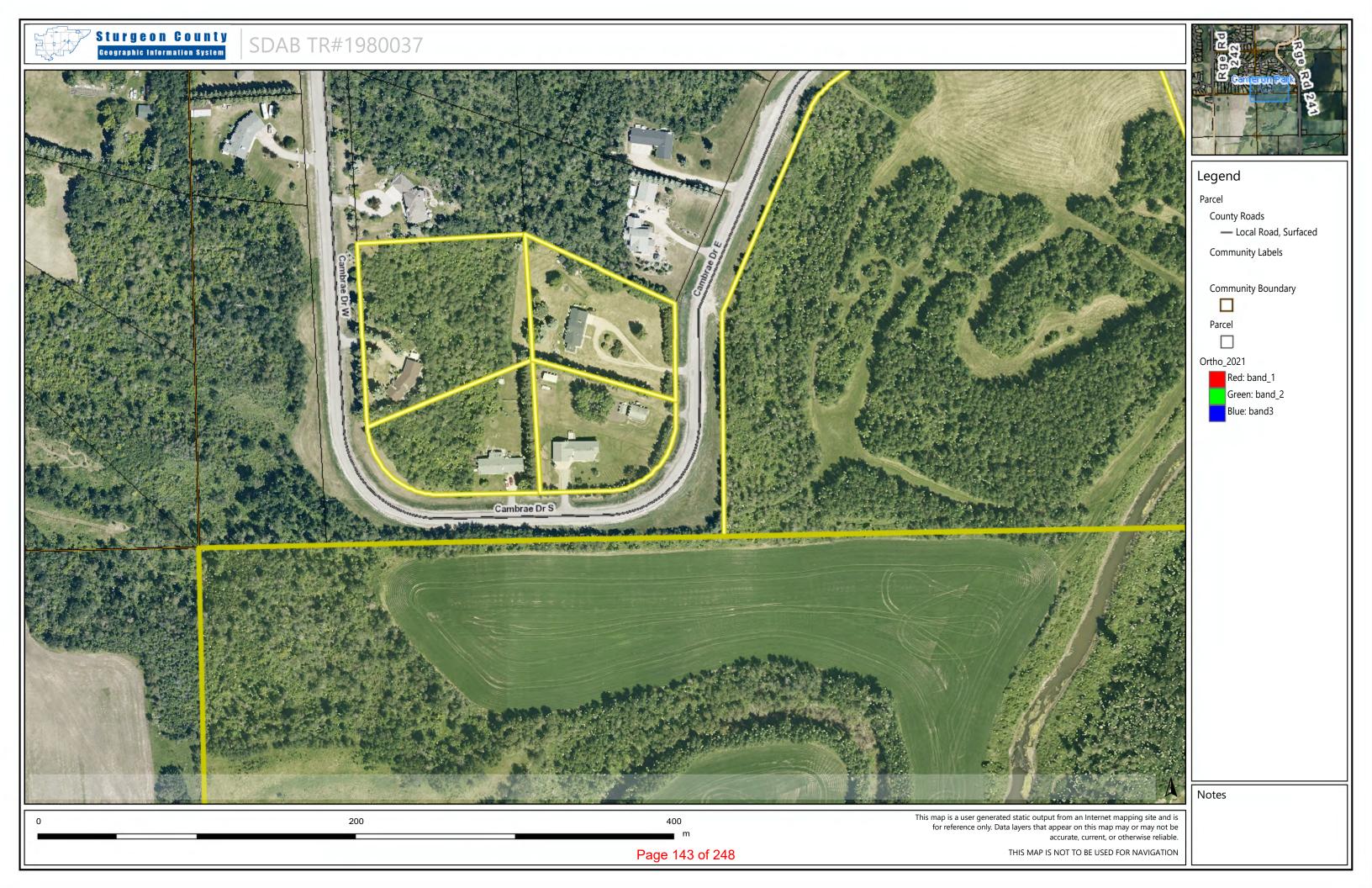

#### **PRELIMINARY**

- Permit 305305-25-D0126 to construct an uncovered deck for an above ground swimming pool was issued on May 29, 2025 with a 21-day appeal period ending June 19, 2025.
- An accessory building is a permitted use and therefore notification to adjacent landowners is not required. However, all permits are advertised on Sturgeon County's website.
- The Development Authority recommends the Board does not support hearing the appeal for the following reason:
  - The appeal was received 110 days past the deadline

#### PROPERTY INFORMATION

• The residential property is developed with a Single Detached Dwelling and accessory buildings, as well as the subject above ground pool and deck.

#### **BACKGROUND**

- The subject development permit was issued in accordance with the Land Use Bylaw 1385/17. As well, both building permits for the pool (305305-25-B0165) and deck (305305-25-D0185) were issued and inspected under the Safety Codes Act were closed compliant May 26, and June 9, 2025 respectively.
- A complaint was received on July 22, 2025 regarding the operation of a home based business from the property known as K9 Drifters.
- The Development Compliance Officer worked with the affected individuals to achieve compliance. A Warning Letter was issued on September 5, 2025 to cease operations or apply for a permit to operate a business.



- The landowners ceased operations of the business and therefore no permit is required. The file was closed September 30, 2025.
- The appeal was filed on October 7, 2025 which is 110 days past the mandated appeal period.
- The appellant has stated the reasons to appeal to be summarized as follows:
  - Misleading information concerning the intended use deck vs dock
  - Size of pool with "docks" and ramps
  - Commercial nature of use

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

- The Municipal Government Act Section 685(3) Grounds for Appeal states "Despite subsections (1) and (2), no appeal lies in respect of the issuance of a development permit for a permitted use unless the provisions of the land use bylaw were relaxed, varied or misinterpreted or the application for the development permit was deemed to be refused under section 683.1(8)."
- The Development Authority recommends the Board does not support the appeal for the following reasons:
  - The appeal was received 110 days past the deadline
  - All permits were issued and the structure built according to the approved plans
  - The Land Use Bylaw was neither relaxed, varied or misinterpreted and further, does not regulate sizes of pools or decks nor the personal use of them.
  - The operation of the business is a separate issue which has been ceased and could be considered under a separate use and permit application.

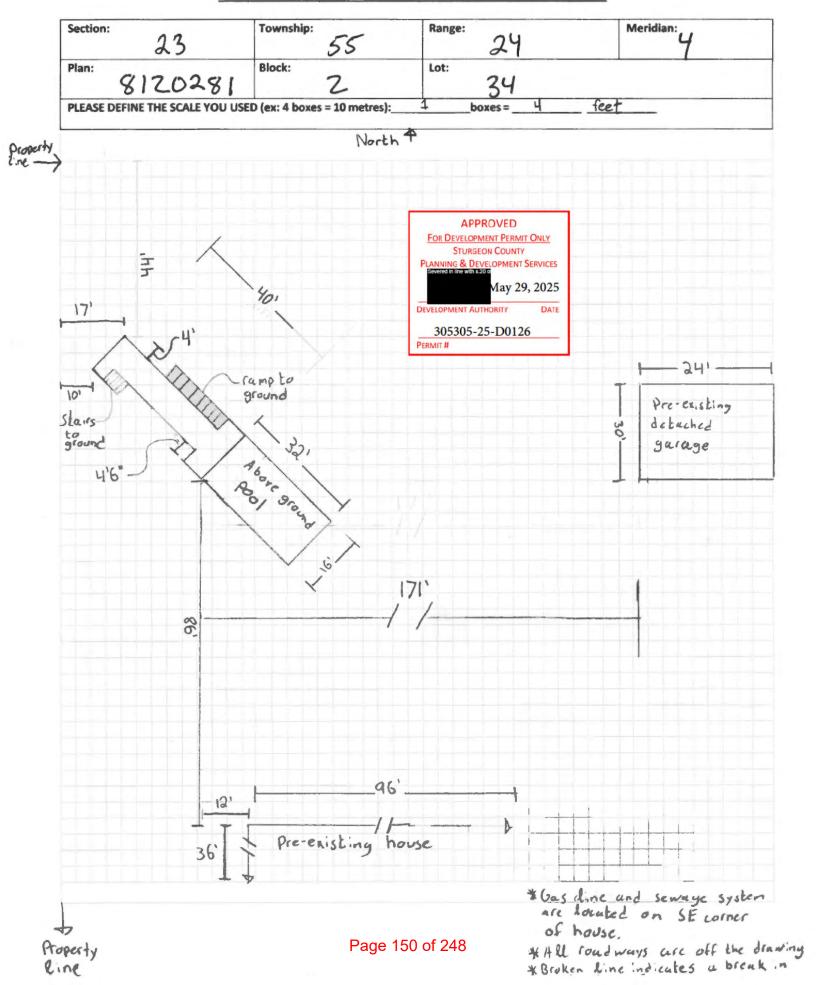

### **Background Information**

- The subject development permit was issued in accordance with the Land Use Bylaw 1385/17. As well, both building permits for the pool and deck were issued and inspected under the Safety Codes Act were closed compliant May 26, and June 9, 2025 respectively.
- A complaint was received on July 22, 2025 regarding the operation of a home based business from the property known as K9 Drifters.
- The Development Compliance Officer worked with the affected individuals to achieve compliance. A Warning Letter was issued on September 5, 2025 to cease operations or apply for a permit to operate a business.





### **Background Information**

- The landowners ceased operations of the business and therefore no permit is required. The file was closed September 30, 2025.
- The appeal was filed on October 7, 2025 which is 110 days past the mandated appeal period.
- The appellant has stated the reasons to appeal to be summarized as follows:
  - Misleading information concerning the intended use deck vs dock
  - Size of pool with "docks" and ramps
  - Commercial nature of use

### Relevant Policy & Legislation

### **Municipal Government Act**

Section 685(3) Grounds for Appeal states "Despite subsections (1) and (2), no appeal lies in respect of the issuance of a development permit for a permitted use unless the provisions of the land use bylaw were relaxed, varied or misinterpreted or the application for the development permit was deemed to be refused under section 683.1(8)."

### Recommendation

The Development Authority recommends the Board does not support the appeal for the following reasons:

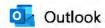
- The appeal was received 110 days past the deadline

#### Conclusion

In conclusion, even after being given several verbal warnings and a formal cease letter from the Compliance Bylaw officer, business owners Haley Blomquist-Schafers, Kaelan Kelly, along with landowners Debra and Gregg Blomquist, continued to ignore and violate the three verbal cease orders and one written warning letter to stop K9Drifters' business activities. They persisted in running K9Drifters by masking their operations as defining the activities as "social friends."

A primary concern involves K9Drifters, specifically its owners Haley Blomquist-Schafers and Kaelan Kelly, who continue to utilize the structure under a false pretense, disguising their individual sessions as social interactions. K9Drifters operates by conducting individual sessions while misrepresenting these as "social friends," despite videos clearly depicting Haley instructing guests in a manner that contradicts the essence of a social friendship. Haley Blomquist-Schafers is affiliated with a dog sporting club known as K9Drifters and carries out club activities at the location. It is important to emphasize that neither of the owners resides at 33 55312; they merely arrive, causing a significant disruption of noise for extended periods by conducting business, and then leave, which prevents us from enjoying our property and home due to the noise level and the close proximity of the open structure.

It is essential to recognize that anyone can be acknowledged and masquerade as a "friend"; however, the truth is that a business operation is occurring. This can be evaluated by observing the number of individuals who arrive independently and stay for a short duration, which corresponds with the service menu for pool time and the nature of interactions among the involved parties. Once the individuals finishes their pool time, they leave, and the next individual arrives to begin their session.

They have also promoted the availability of pool bookings until September 30. It is quite alarming and distressing that the service menu includes half-day pool bookings for private events. Once again, the potential to disguise these pool rentals as personal gatherings is significant, and given their previously demonstrated behaviors of masking training sessions, we believe they will persist in utilizing this approach in the future.

In light of their noncompliance with the cease orders, a formal written cease order was issued on September 5. However, they once again ignored this written directive and continued their business activities until September 21, 2025. The issue at hand is that the pool season has now concluded for the year, and it is certain that the dock will reopen in 2026, allowing the masquerade and false pretenses to continue.

Both K9Drifter owners and the landowners have already exhibited a complete disregard for ceasing business operations after receiving three verbal warnings and one written stop order, and they still attempted to conceal their operations.

The reason for our appeal after the deadline is as follows:

We were unaware of the structure being constructed and its actual commercial purpose.
 The landowners did not communicate with us about the structure or its intentions.

- 2. It was only upon the completion of the structure that we became aware of the nature of the business involved and its adverse effect on our enjoyment of the property, as well as the inconvenience caused by the noise level and the impact of our property value.
- 3. We were collaborating with the Compliance Officer to address the commercial usage.
- 4. Neither the Compliance Officer nor Ms. Thompson, Manger, Planning and Development notified us about the possibility of an appeal. We were under the impression that the Compliance Officer was advocating for us and would file the appeal for the permit as he had indicated he would, if was not until September that we discovered the Compliance Officer would not act on our behalf regarding the permit, prompting us to investigate our options, which ultimately led us to this appeal process.

The structure in question is situated merely 125 feet from our residence. Its considerable size enables us to see and hear all activities occurring inside from within our home. The existence of this structure, along with the pool activities, significantly intrudes upon our privacy, compelling us to close our windows during the summer months to mitigate the noise Unfortunately, even this measure does not completely eliminate the disturbances we endure.

Moreover, the structure is highly unattractive, acting as an eyesore that reduces our property value, white also raising serious concerns regarding our security and privacy. The noise produced by the dogs and their owners violates our right to enjoy our property. The increase in traffic is another issue. Anyone using the pool dock can easily look into our backyard, allowing them to see our home, surroundings, and any activities we may be engaged in at that time. With this structure present, we find ourselves tacking privacy and a sense of security. The absence of separation and the resulting loss of privacy have become increasingly troubling for us. The main reason we have lived in a suburban area for over 18 years is to escape the urban setting and enjoy peace and safety. Unfortunately, this has been jeopardized by the construction of this commercial-sized structure. We believe it is crucial to address these concerns to restore the peace and comfort we once enjoyed in our living space.

The main objective of the pool was initially designed for a commercial dog diving dock, not for leisure use in a backyard. The actual purpose of this facility was to run a dog diving business for Haley Blomquist-Schafers, who does not live on the premises. This was clear from the outset, even before the permit application was submitted, as evidenced by the commencement of advertising for the dock business on May 12, which occurred 8 days prior to the appeal deadline of June 19 and before the dock's construction started.

We maintain that the structure is unsuitable for a residential neighborhood, as it has evidently been designed and built to comply with dog diving sports regulations for competitive and commercial use.

We believe that if the permit application had been completed truthfully, indicating that the true intention was to run a dog diving business, it would not have received approval.

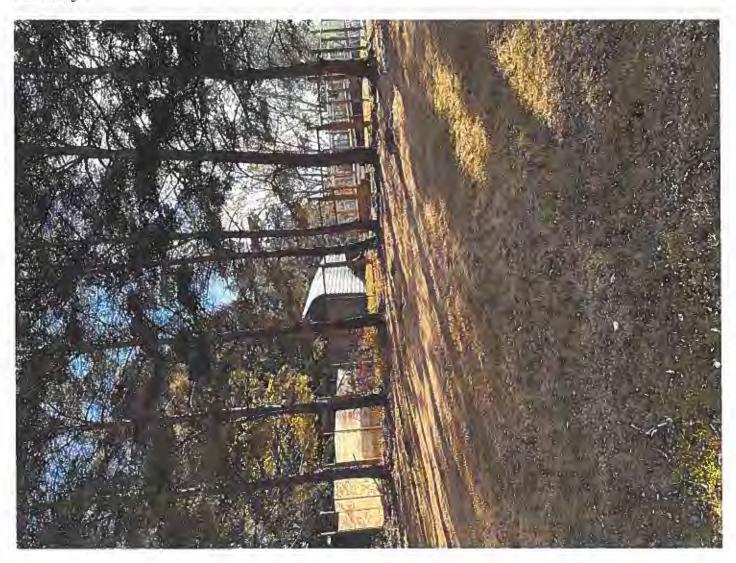

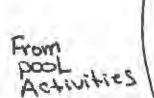

## **Subdivision and Development Appeal Hearing Process**

The hearing is a formal meeting and the length of time can vary. Hearings are generally scheduled Tuesday afternoons at the Sturgeon County Centre in the Town of Morinville or via videoconference.

Persons who file an appeal are expected to make a verbal presentation to the Board. Persons who have been notified of the appeal also have the right to present a verbal, written and/or visual presentation to the Board. *This information should be submitted to the Secretary at least five (5) days in advance of the hearing, so it can be included within the hearing package*. If desired, parties may have someone, or an agent, speak on their behalf. If a number of appeals are filed on the same subdivision or development, it is recommended that a spokesperson be selected to organize presentations so that evidence is not repetitive.

The Board is not an evidence seeking body. It relies on the written evidence presented, as well as verbal submissions at the hearing, as the basis for their decision. Therefore, it is critical that persons appearing before the Board ensure that sufficient evidence is presented to support their respective positions.

When presenting an appeal, keep in mind the Board does not consider precedent when making its decision. Each application is judged on its own merits.

## At the hearing . . .

Anyone in attendance with an interest in the appeal enters the hearing room, joins the videoconference, or dials in just before the scheduled start time of the hearing on the scheduled date of the hearing.

- 1. The meeting is called to order by the Chair.
- 2. The Chair welcomes everyone and gives a brief outline as to how the hearing will proceed.
- 3. The Chair will have all board members, staff and people involved in the appeal introduce themselves and those present are asked if there are any objections to the Board members hearing the appeal.

- 4. A representative of Sturgeon County Planning and Development will outline the background of the appeal and why the decision was made.
- 5. The Chairman will then ask:
  - The Appellant to introduce themselves for the record.
  - The Appellant then presents his/her position or concerns with respect to the matter being considered by the Board. Development Appeal Board members question the Appellant.
  - Clearly state your reasons for the appeal.
     Information such as photographs, illustrative materials and well-prepared drawings that you wish to present should be submitted to the Secretary at least five (5) days in advance of the hearing, so that the information can be included within the hearing package that is circulated.
  - Stick to the planning facts and support them with quantifiable (measurable) data.
  - State the detailed issues about the site in the context of the surrounding properties and the impact on the community.
  - The Board will then hear from anyone else in favor of the appeal (persons who filed an appeal or support the position of the Appellant). Following each presentation Board members may ask questions.
  - The Board will then hear from anyone opposed to the appeal (persons who opposethe position of the Appellant).
- 6. After all presentations have been heard, the Chairman will give the Appellants the right to respond to new information. This is an opportunity to refute information and evidence presented since the last time you spoke that you could not have reasonably anticipated. It is not an opportunity to reargue your case or create new argument.
- 7. The Chairman advises that the Board will deliberate in a Closed Session and a written decision will be mailed within 15 days from the date of the decision as per legislation.

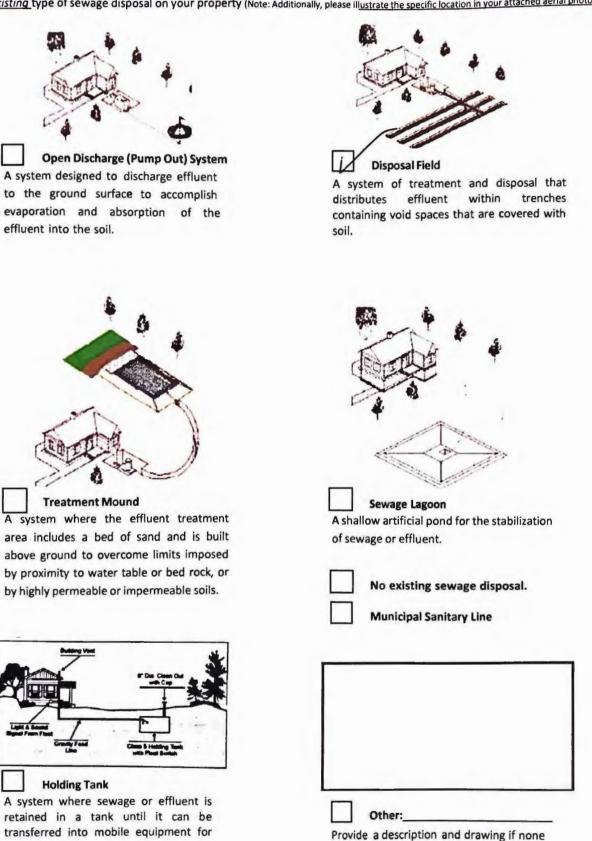

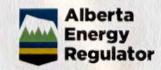

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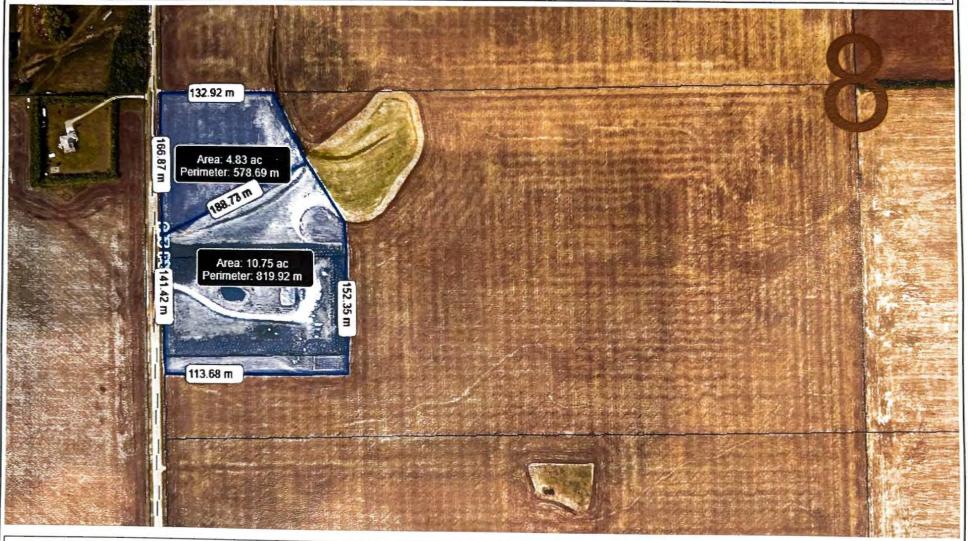

Your application for subdivision was APPROVED CONDITIONALLY by the Subdivision Authority on October 2, 2025, subject to the following conditions:

#### THE CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL ARE:

- Pursuant to Provision 654(1)(d) of the MGA, any outstanding taxes on the subject properties shall be paid or arrangements be made, to the satisfaction of Sturgeon County, for the payment thereof.
- 2) The applicant shall retain the services of a professional Alberta Land Surveyor, who shall submit a drawing to Sturgeon County resembling Exhibit 2, dated September 26, 2025, and submit it in a manner that is acceptable to Land Titles.
- 3) Pursuant to Provision 662(1) of the MGA, as illustrated in Exhibit 2 and as required by Sturgeon County Engineering Services, a 5-metre-wide area parallel and adjacent to the boundary of Proposed Lot 1 and the adjacent road shall be dedicated as road allowance via plan of survey at no cost to Sturgeon County.
- 4) Pursuant to Provision 662(1) of the MGA, as illustrated in Exhibit 2 and as required by Sturgeon County Engineering Services, a 5-metre-wide area parallel and adjacent to the boundary of the Remnant Lot and the adjacent road shall be acquired by Sturgeon County in the future via the terms and conditions of a land acquisition agreement (note: this agreement to be prepared by Sturgeon County).
- 5) All upgrades to existing culverts and/or existing approaches, and construction/removal of approaches, as determined necessary by the Development Engineering Officer, will be the responsibility of the developer and upgraded to the satisfaction of Sturgeon County in accordance with General Municipal Servicing Standards, before this subdivision is endorsed.

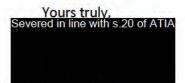

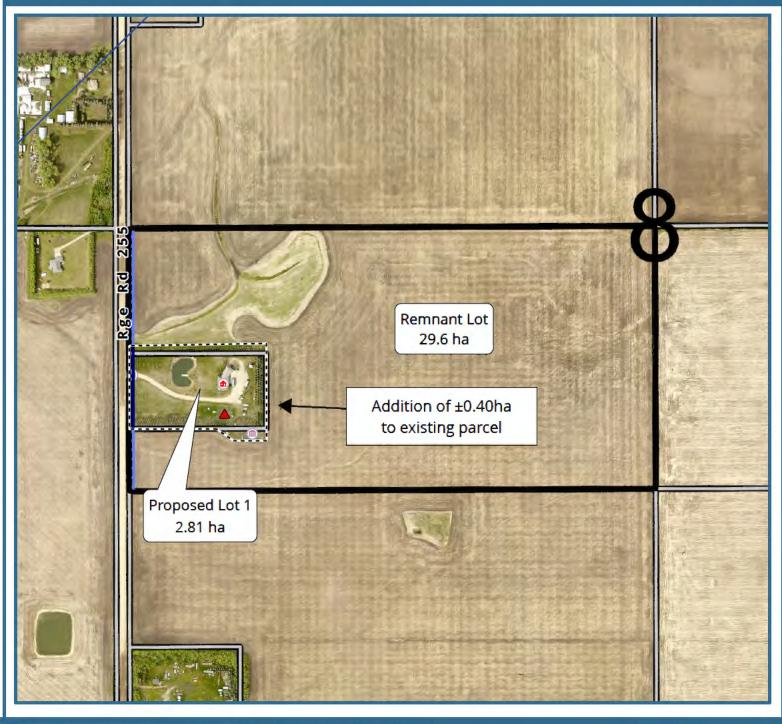

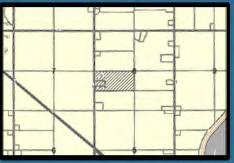

## PART I - APPLICATION DETAILS:

 As illustrated in Exhibit 1 the applicant proposes both a lot line adjustment and new acreage parcel. The lot line adjustment would increase the existing parcel from 2.41 hectares (5.98 acres) to 4.35 hectares (10.75 acres).

#### - Proposed Lot 2:

- No existing approach. One must be constructed to General Municipal Servicing Standards. The location shall be 90m from the existing approach on the adjacent parcel.
- Sturgeon Drainage master plan identifies significant Flood Risk in the proposed lot 2, Sturgeon County requires a Hydrological analysis (stamped and signed by a P. Eng.) to determine what the 1:100 yr. flood inundation elevation is on the parcel as it is currently undeveloped. The analysis must also include geotechnical investigation of the proposed building site location to determine what the basement, or finish floor elevation should be within the building pocket, ensuring a minimum of 0.6m of freeboard above the ground water table. The analysis will also establish the lowest building opening elevation, ensuring it is a minimum of 1m above the 1:100 yr. HWL. Recommendations, for overall site grading, and identifying any additional development constraints for the site should be included within the analysis. Please refer to the attached map showing the flood risk from the Sturgeon County Drainage Master Plan and wetland areas from the Government of Alberta Wetland map.

#### - Remnant Lot:

- In accordance with the Grid Right of Way Dedications and Acquisition policy, 5 metres required via land acquisition agreement adjacent to Rge Rd 255.
- No existing approach. One must be constructed to General Municipal Servicing Standards.
- Sturgeon County requires a Hydrological analysis (stamped and signed by a P. Eng.) to determine what the 1:100 yr. flood inundation elevation is for the parcel <u>if</u> permanent infrastructures will be developed inside that area.

#### 3. Alberta Health Services:

- The existing private sewage disposal systems that are on the lands are to meet compliance with the current Alberta Private Sewage and Disposal Systems Regulation.

- 4. No Objections:
  - Sturgeon County Protective Services, Apex Utilities, Telus, Fortis Alberta.
- 5. No Responses:

### PART IV - ANALYSIS:

- 1. This application proposed to adjust the lot lines of an existing acreage parcel and subdivide a new parcel in the northwestern corner of the lands.
- 2. This application is <u>NOT</u> consistent with the Municipal Development Plan's "Residential Type 4" policies (see Appendix 2), and with the Land Use Bylaw's "AG Agriculture regulations (see Appendix 3).

On this quarter section, the full allotment of agricultural subdivisions have already been completed. It has been split in half with one acreage parcel subdivided off each half quarter section resulting in the maximum of four parcels.

The creation of Proposed Lot 2 would result in the fifth parcel and third acreage on this quarter section which contradicts the maximums outlined in the Municipal Development Plan (Policy 2.3.12) and the Land Use Bylaw (Part 11.1.3(a)). As such, administration cannot support this parcel.

The existing boundaries of Proposed Lot 1 are misaligned with the mature tree stand and greenhouse that provide a clear and defined break between the land utilized for the acreage and the surrounding cultivated farmland. The lot line adjustment of Proposed Lot 1 looks to accomplish two goals. The first is to slightly adjust the lot lines to the north and south to incorporate the tree stand/greenhouse, and the second is to incorporate roughly 3 acres of flood prone lands into the acreage.

- 3. Part 11.1.3(e) of the Land Use Bylaw outlines that an acreage size larger than 2.47 acres can be accommodated to:
  - "...encompass mature shelterbelts, existing buildings or any other related features associated with an existing farmstead."

Administration can adjust the parcel boundary to the north and south to better align the with the mature shelterbelt and greenhouse. This will add roughly 1 acre to the existing parcel. However, incorporating three acres of heavily flood prone agricultural lands into the acreage parcel does not align with the Land Use Bylaw or Municipal Development Plan. The updated configuration can be found within Exhibit 2.

- 4. As Proposed Lot 1 is an already established acreage and the new proposed boundaries avoid the seasonal drainage course and heavily flood prone areas, administration can ensure the parcel is suited for its intended purpose as per the Municipal Government Act. As such, no hydrological or geotechnical report will be required for this application. However, future development/subdivision of the surrounding lands may be subject to engineering reports based on the location of the proposal.
- 5. It appears that the existing septic field would continue to comply with the Alberta Private Sewage Systems Standard of Practice, should this application be approved.
- 6. Money in lieu of municipal reserve will be required, as detailed in condition six. As reserves have already been claimed in the existing acreage parcel, only the additional lands incorporated through the lot line adjustment will be utilized in the calculation.

## **PART V** – **DECISION**:

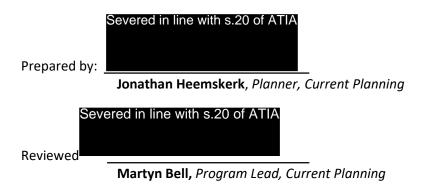
This application for subdivision is **APPROVED** subject to the following conditions:

- 1) Pursuant to Provision 654(1)(d) of the MGA, any outstanding taxes on the subject properties shall be paid or arrangements be made, to the satisfaction of Sturgeon County, for the payment thereof.
- 2) The applicant shall retain the services of a professional Alberta Land Surveyor, who shall submit a drawing to Sturgeon County resembling Exhibit 2, dated September 26, 2025, and submit it in a manner that is acceptable to Land Titles.
- 3) Pursuant to Provision 662(1) of the MGA, as illustrated in Exhibit 2 and as required by Sturgeon County Engineering Services, a 5-metre-wide area parallel and adjacent to the boundary of Proposed Lot 1 and the adjacent road shall be dedicated as road allowance via plan of survey at no cost to Sturgeon County.
- 4) Pursuant to Provision 662(1) of the MGA, as illustrated in Exhibit 2 and as required by Sturgeon County Engineering Services, a 5-metre-wide area parallel and adjacent to the boundary of the Remnant Lot and the adjacent road shall be acquired by Sturgeon County in the future via the terms and conditions of a land acquisition agreement (note: this agreement to be prepared by Sturgeon County).
- 5) All upgrades to *existing* culverts and/or *existing* approaches, and construction/removal of approaches, as determined necessary by the Development Engineering Officer, will be the responsibility of the developer and upgraded to the satisfaction of Sturgeon County in accordance with General Municipal Servicing Standards, *before* this subdivision is endorsed.

- 6) Pursuant to Provision 666 of the MGA, money in lieu of municipal reserve shall be provided to Sturgeon County respecting 10% of the additional area included into Proposed Lot 1. A payment will be made in place of reserves equal to \$881.34 (determined at a rate of \$22,033.52 per hectare X 10% X 0.40 hectares = \$881.34). The money-in-lieu calculation will be based on the actual amount of land (in hectares) shown on a plan of survey.
- 7) Pursuant to Provision 669 of the MGA, municipal reserves owing on the Remnant Lot shall be deferred by caveat (note: this caveat to be prepared by Sturgeon County).
- 8) The applicant is to obtain all necessary permits to comply with the Land Use Bylaw to the satisfaction of the Development Authority.

#### **ADVISORY NOTES**

- Pursuant to Section 2.4.3 of the LUB, at the development permit stage on any property, it is highly recommended that the developer retain the services of a qualified engineering professional to prepare and submit a geotechnical investigation confirming that the proposed building site on is suitable for development and prescribing any preventative engineering measures to be taken to make the building site suitable for future development or future development suitable for the building site.
- Pursuant to the Water Act and the Alberta Wetland Policy, any future development or site grading which might alter or disturb a wetland may require additional approvals from Alberta Environment and Parks.
- The subject properties shall not be used in any manner or way that impedes or will impede the use of adjacent lands for agricultural purposes or agricultural operations, as defined in the Agricultural Operation Practices Act, RSA 2000 c.A-7.

#### Conditions of subdivision approval

- **655(1)** A subdivision authority may impose the following conditions or any other conditions permitted to be imposed by the subdivision and development regulations on a subdivision approval issued by it:
  - (a) any conditions to ensure that this Part, including section 618.3(1), and the statutory plans and land use bylaws and the regulations under this Part affecting the land proposed to be subdivided are complied with;
  - (b) a condition that the applicant enter into an agreement with the municipality to do any or all of the following:
    - (i) to construct or pay for the construction of a road required to give access to the subdivision;
    - (ii) to construct or pay for the construction of
      - (A) a pedestrian walkway system to serve the subdivision, or
      - (B) pedestrian walkways to connect the pedestrian walkway system serving the subdivision with a

pedestrian walkway system that serves or is proposed to serve an adjacent subdivision,

or both:

- (iii) to install or pay for the installation of a public utility described in section 616(v)(i) to (ix) that is necessary to serve the subdivision, whether or not the public utility is, or will be, located on the land that is the subject of the subdivision approval;
- (iv) to construct or pay for the construction of
  - (A) off-street or other parking facilities, and
  - (B) loading and unloading facilities;
- (v) to pay an off-site levy or redevelopment levy imposed by bylaw;
- (vi) to give security to ensure that the terms of the agreement under this section are carried out.
- (2) A municipality may register a caveat under the Land Titles Act in respect of an agreement under subsection (1)(b) against the certificate of title for the parcel of land that is the subject of the subdivision.
- (3) If a municipality registers a caveat under subsection (2), the municipality must discharge the caveat when the agreement has been complied with.
- (4) Where a condition on a subdivision approval has, prior to the coming into force of this subsection, required the applicant to install a public utility or pay an amount for a public utility referred to in subsection (1)(b)(iii), that condition is deemed to have been validly imposed, whether or not the public utility was located on the land that was the subject of the subdivision approval.

#### RG 1.3 ENACTING RESPONSIBLE SUBDIVISION AND DEVELOPMENT PRACTICES

Through the establishment of policies and procedures, that give due regard to federal, provincial and municipal requirements to facilitate orderly development.

- **1.3.1** Shall apply the full entitlements of environmental, municipal and school reserve dedication during the subdivision process, in accordance with the Municipal Government Act (MGA).
- 1.3.2 Shall apply the requirements outlined within the relevant Province of Alberta regulation related to Subdivision and Development.
- **1.3.3** Shall apply the requirements outlined within the Province of Alberta's Water Act.
- 1.3.4 Shall support "right-to-farm legislation" by applying the requirements outlined within the Province of Alberta's Agriculture Operations Practices Act (AOPA). When referred to by the Natural Resources Conservation Board (NRCB), Sturgeon County will apply the objectives of the Growth Mangement Strategy in the referred evaluation (i.e., new or expanding Confined Feeding Operations).

- 1.3.5 Shall refer to and apply the provincial setback regulations and guidelines respective to sour gas and other oil and gas facilities, including pipelines, when considering subdivision and development applications. Proposed land uses in proximity to sour gas facilities shall minimize risk to the public's health and safety.
- 1.3.6 Shall ensure that new development be sited with consideration of the Federal Government development restrictions related to both the Canadian Forces Base Edmonton and Villeneuve Airport Approach Path.
- 1.3.7 Shall identify needed infrastructure improvements, both at the regional and local level, in an effort to determine, prioritize and fund infrastructure required to obtain the strategic goals of the Growth Managmenet Strategy and the Municipal Development Plan.

- 1.3.8 Shall restrict proposed development that may constrain infrastructure networks that are imperative for the growth and development associated with the strategic goals of the Growth Management Strategy. As part of the application process, Sturgeon County may require an application to demonstrate that no adverse impact will occur due to proposed development.
- **1.3.9** Shall ensure that the distribution and timing of future development coincides, and is contiguous with, infrastructure improvements.
- 1.3.10 Shall ensure that both subdivision and development meet the standards outlined within the Sturgeon County General Municipal Servicing Standards. Standards should be reviewed and updated along with other County regulatory policies on a regular basis.

- **1.3.11** Should collaborate with industry and municipal partners to develop, update and align risk management initiatives regarding heavy industrial development located within and along County borders.
- 1.3.12 May collaborate with industry on the development of renewable energy technologies to support future growth opportunities. Energy future options are required to outline benefits for the environment, economy and public health and address potential challenges related to safety, costs and any other needs that would ensure a successful transition to a renewable energy future.
- 1.3.13 Shall not permit development on Hazardous Lands that are deemed undevelopable or may result in life loss or injury, property damage, social and economic disruption or environmental degradation.

- **1.3.14** Shall direct subdivision and development activity away from significant natural resource deposits, where activities have the potential to sterilize future supply and extraction.
- **1.3.15** Should establish general development design guidelines for Residential and Non-Residential developments.
- 1.3.16 May require that the applicant of a development apply the principles and guidelines of Crime Prevention through Environmental Design within subdivision and development reviews to guide design and ensure effective use of the built environment.
- **1.3.17** Shall support the policies and procedures as set out in the Municipal Emergency Operations Plan.

- 1.3.18 Shall ensure that future fire-fighting service requirements for the County are considered and are strategically situated to provide services to a variety of Sturgeon County residents.
- **1.3.19** Shall ensure that new development be sited with consideration to the fire hazard severity of the site, the type of development and the risk added by the development to the fire hazard risk.
- **1.3.20** Shall institute a consistent method of addressing encroachments on municipal property to ensure equitable treatment and that the public amenity is not compromised.
- **1.3.20** Shall adopt and apply enforcement procedures to clarify and establish (for both those impacted and the offender) a course of action when a use or activity is in violation of the County's Bylaws.



## RC 2.2 APPLYING RESPONSIBLE RESIDENTIAL SUBDIVISION AND DEVELOPMENT PRACTICES

Through the assurance that proposed developments will consider and account for the future needs of Sturgeon County residents.

- 2.2.1 Shall require that subdivision and development proposals that exceed the maximum allowable density or intent of the identified Residential Type, or differs from an existing Planning Document, submit a new or revised Planning Document in conformance with policies outlined within the Municipal Development Plan (MDP).
- 2.2.2 Shall prevent any residential subdivision layout that limits future development potential, or that may result in development restrictions of the adjacent parcel.
- **2.2.3** Should discourage the use of panhandles as a way to provide residential subdivisions with legal and physical access to a municipal roadway.
- 2.2.4 Shall ensure that subdivision and development does not preclude the possibility of future road widening.

- 2.2.5 Shall mitigate the impact of natural resource extraction activity on the local community by establishing setbacks and criteria guiding the interaction between residential and Primary Industry development. Where existing residential development may be impacted by resource extraction activity, efforts to minimize the impact on the existing residential development shall be demonstrated and adhered to.
- 2.2.6 Should investigate and monitor the impacts of new and existing residential subdivision and development activity on County infrastructure and establish funding mechanisms for benefiting lands and responsibilities (e.g., off-site levies or local improvement taxes) to pay for needed improvements and upgrades as a result of the associated activity.
- 2.2.7 Shall ensure subdivision and development compliments the established character of the area, complies with the associated Residential Type policies, addresses any infrastructure constraints and conforms to the criteria outlined in the Land Use Bylaw.

- 2.2.8 Should identify and address the location, type and needs of Market and Non-Market Affordable Housing required within Sturgeon County. Non-Market Affordable Housing should be accommodated within areas identified for intensified residential development.
- 2.2.9 May collaborate with the development industry and not-for-profit organizations to facilitate the diversification of housing choices; the mix of housing sizes and types should meet affordability, accessibility and lifestyle needs of various groups.

## Residential Type 4 - Agricultural Residential

Residential Type 4 provides Sturgeon County's rural population with options that support Primary Industry viability while maintaining a rural character.

Residential Type 4 options are available throughout Sturgeon County; however they exclude existing developed areas.

- **2.3.11** Shall support the subdivision of agricultural land to ensure the long-term sustainability and function of the agricultural land base.
- 2.3.12 Shall apply 64 hectares/160 acres as the basic agricultural land base unit, and unless otherwise indicated within a Planning Document, the maximum agricultural density is four (4) parcels for every 64 hectares/160 acres.
- **2.3.13** Shall adhere to the following general agricultural subdivision principles:
- a. Subdivision of agricultural land should result in parcels appropriate for the type of agriculture use(s) common in the area and sufficiently sized to maintain flexibility for future changes in the type or size of agricultural operations.
- Subdivision for any purpose should minimize the amount of agricultural land taken out of production and must not hinder the operation of surrounding agricultural land uses.
- c. Subdivision for agriculture-related, valueadded, and non-agricultural land uses should be directed to cluster sites, and wherever possible to lower capability land.

#### SDA 1.1 RESIDENTIAL CHARACTER OUTCOME

Supporting the agricultural industry by acknowledging the unique features of the working landscape.

SDA 1.1 residential character output Sturgeon County will support the long-term residential character outcome by:

- a. Requiring proposed developments for future Hamlet development to undertake planning and consultation with landowners and stakeholders regarding long-term growth aspirations (at the discretion of the County). Consultation shall address land use, servicing and access issues related to future development. Associated Planning Documents are to identify sustainable types and scales of Residential and Non-Residential activity, as well as the associated infrastructure and community services levels required to support future development.
- b. Giving regard to the existing residential character of each Hamlet by requiring proposals for residential infill density to ensure that proposed lot location, size and servicing complement the existing community. Proposed development to encourage a range of housing options subject to infrastructure capacities. Depending on the scale and impact of the proposed development, the approving authority may require additional Planning Documents to accurately assess the application.
- c. Discouraging the development or expansion of Confined Feeding Operations from Town municipal boundaries (Morinville, Bon Accord, Gibbons, Legal, Redwater) and Sturgeon County communities with densities in exceedance of Residential Type 4, in an effort to minimize land-use conflicts between working landscapes and residential communities.

#### PART 11 PRIMARY INDUSTRY DISTRICTS

#### 11.1 AG – AGRICULTURE DISTRICT



.1 General Purpose

This district accommodates traditional agricultural operations and the supportive services that are essential to grow and sustain the agricultural industry. This district distinguishes between major, minor and residential where:

AG-Major are tracts of land 16ha (39.5ac) or larger in size;

AG-Minor are parcels between 4ha (9.8ac) and 15.9ha (39.3ac); and

AG-Residential are parcels smaller than 4ha (9.8ac).

#### .3 Subdivision Regulations

- (a) Unless otherwise indicated within a planning document, a quarter section in the AG district of 64.7ha (160ac) shall contain a maximum combined density of four parcels, comprised of:
  - two AG Major parcels of approximately 32.4ha (80ac) each or alternative sizes necessary due to land fragmentation; and
  - two AG Residential parcels (one of which may be subdivided from each AG Major parcel having a minimum size of 32.4ha (80ac) in accordance with Paragraph 11.1.3(e) of this Bylaw).
- (b) Notwithstanding Subparagraph 11.1.3(a)(ii), the Subdivision Authority may consider the subdivision of a second AG – Residential parcel from the same 32ha (80 ac) AG parcel when all of the following criteria are met:

- (i) no other parcel has been subdivided from the abutting 32ha (80 ac) AG parcel on that same quarter section; and
- (ii) no secondary dwelling exists on the abutting 32ha (80 acre) AG parcel on that same quarter section; and

- Where an AG Major parcel is either smaller or larger than the conventional 64.7ha (160ac) and/or 32.4ha (80ac) parcel size (e.g. due to the presence of a redistricted parcel(s), or surveying anomalies due to river lots or land fragmentation), the subdivision regulations are as follows:
  - AG Major parcels between 16ha (39.5ac) and 47.9ha (118.4ac) shall be considered equivalent to a 32.4ha (80ac) AG parcel (i.e. half a quarter section).
  - AG Major parcels between 48ha (118.5ac) and 79.9ha (197.5ac) shall be considered equivalent to a 64.7ha (160ac) AG parcel (i.e. a full quarter section).
  - (iii) AG Major parcels of 80ha (197.6ac) or larger shall be considered equivalent to a 64.7ha (160ac) AG parcel (i.e. a full quarter section) plus any additional subdivision potential beyond 64.7ha (160ac) in accordance with the proportions referenced in Subparagraph 11.1.3(c)(i), (ii) or (iii).
- AG Minor parcels shall be considered equivalent to an AG Residential parcel and therefore have no further subdivision potential.
- The maximum size of an AG Residential parcel shall be 1ha (2.47ac), unless a larger area is essential to:
  - encompass mature shelterbelts, existing buildings or any other related features associated with an existing farmstead (however, additional farmland will not be compromised to accommodate a septic system, the setback distances associated with a septic system, a dugout, or an extensive area of fencing); and/or
  - mitigate any site constraints which could otherwise significantly limit the development potential of a 1ha (2.47ac) parcel or create land use conflicts - such as but not limited to setback distances from pipelines, low-lying or steep topography, inaccessible portions of land or land fragmentation (however, additional farmland will not be compromised when a site constraint could equally be addressed by modifying the location and/or dimensions of the proposed 1ha (2.47ac) parcel).

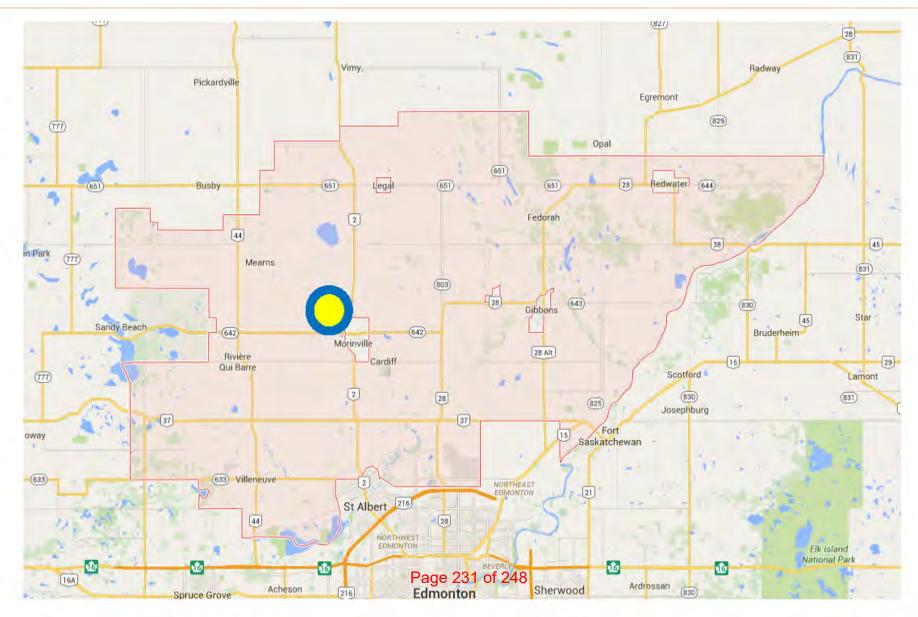

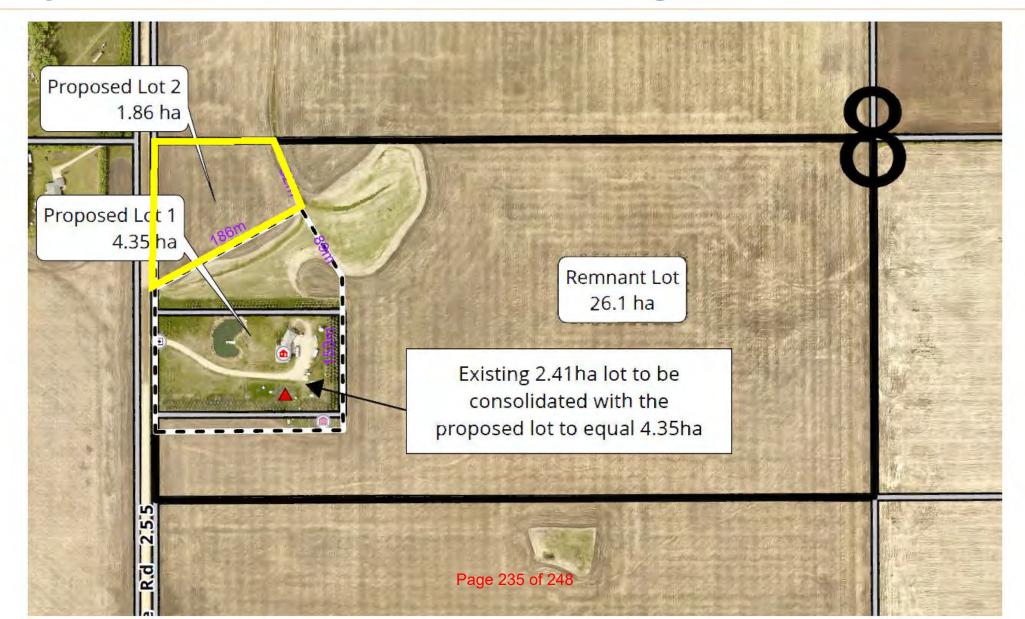

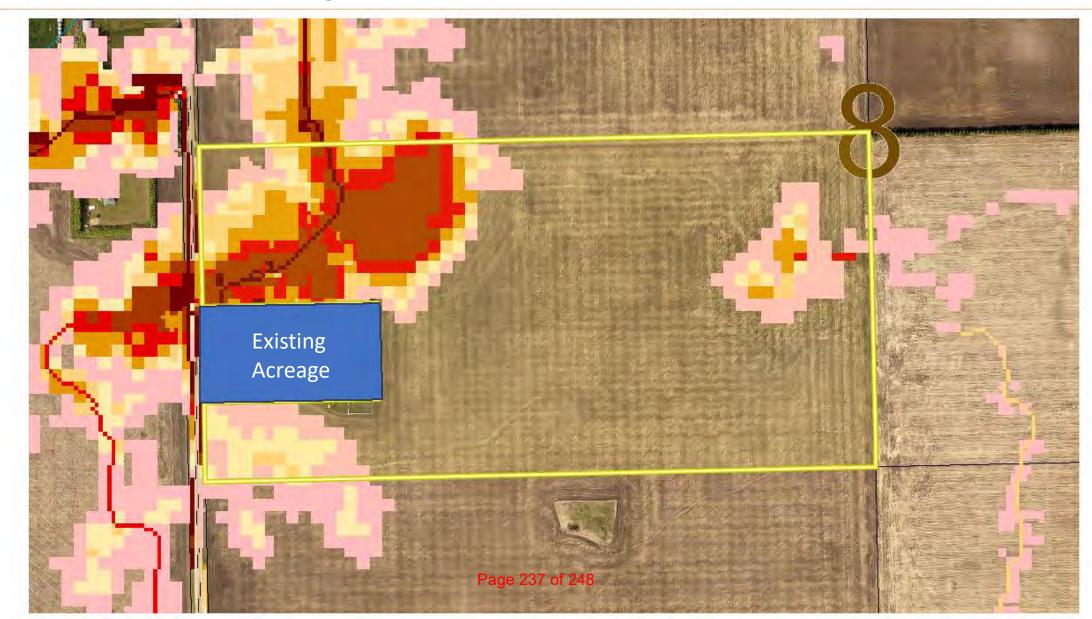

# Subdivision Authority Decision

The Subdivision Authority's decision for **approval (with variations)** is consistent with:

- Land Use Bylaw regulations
- Municipal Development Plan policies
- Municipal Government Act

## **Conditions if Approved as Applied For**

- 1) Pursuant to Provision 654(1)(d) of the MGA, any outstanding taxes on the subject properties shall be paid or arrangements be made, to the satisfaction of Sturgeon County, for the payment thereof.
- 2) The applicant shall retain the services of a professional Alberta Land Surveyor, who shall submit a drawing to Sturgeon County resembling Exhibit 3, submit it in a manner that is acceptable to Land Titles
- Pursuant to Provision 662(1) of the MGA, as illustrated in Exhibit 3 and as required by Sturgeon County Engineering Services, a 5-metre-wide area parallel and adjacent to the boundary of Proposed Lot 1/Proposed Lot 2 and the adjacent road shall be dedicated as road allowance via plan of survey at no cost to Sturgeon County.
- 4) Pursuant to Provision 662(1) of the MGA, as illustrated in Exhibit 3 and as required by Sturgeon County Engineering Services, a 5-metre-wide area parallel and adjacent to the boundary of the Remnant Lot and the adjacent road shall be acquired by Sturgeon County in the future via the terms and conditions of a land acquisition agreement (note: this agreement to be prepared by Sturgeon County).
- All upgrades to existing culverts and/or existing approaches, and construction/removal of approaches, as determined necessary by the Development Engineering Officer, will be the responsibility of the developer and upgraded to the satisfaction of Sturgeon County in accordance with General Municipal Servicing Standards, before this subdivision is endorsed.
- Pursuant to Provision 666 of the MGA, money in lieu of municipal reserve shall be provided to Sturgeon County respecting 10% of the additional area included into Proposed Lot 1 and the new lot of Proposed Lot 2. A payment will be made in place of reserves equal to \$4,979.58 (determined at a rate of \$22,033.52 per hectare X 10% X 2.26 hectares = \$4,979.58). The money-in-lieu calculation will be based on the actual amount of land (in hectares) shown on a plan of survey.
- 7) Pursuant to Provision 669 of the MGA, municipal reserves owing on the Remnant Lot shall be deferred by caveat (note: this caveat to be prepared by Sturgeon County).
- 8) The applicant is to obtain all necessary permits to comply with the Land Use Bylaw to the satisfaction of the Development Authority.
- The applicant shall complete a Hydrological Analysis for Proposed Lot 2 which will be stamped and signed by a P. Eng. and will determine what the 1:100 yr. flood inundation elevation is for the parcel to help establish a basement or finish floor elevation. The analysis will also establish the lowest building opening elevation, ensuring it is a minimum of 0.5m above the 1:100 yr. high water level, and include any development constraints for the parcel. The analysis shall be completed to the satisfaction of Sturgeon County Development Engineering and Langes 24%.
